

International President Wayne Madden's project to reduce illiteracy is another great way to improve our impact in our own communities as well as receive positive recognition of our Lions' organization. We can be Mentors to school children, teachers for adults seeking to improve their literacy skills, and ambassadors of good will through the Peace Poster program and our Student Speaker Contest. Ask the school libraries or Special Ed teachers if they need help with books or other educational supplies.



We need to increase our district membership. Our district is down 13 members from our high of 1279 members on June 2011 (PDG Mike Brown) and our DG Team would like to see our district surpass that number by June 2013. I am asking each club to increase by at least one new member by December 31st, and a Big Thanks! to those clubs who have already added one or more new members. Lions International teaches us that our society is changing, and that we must understand those changes and learn to change with them in order to bring in new community minded members. Our District Team has the tools and is ready to help.





# 'Cozy' sphere comes to Camarillo

Pleasant Valley Recreation and Park District installed a piece of playground equipment for youngsters with special needs at Mission Oaks Park on July 10.

The "cozy cocoon" is a textured plastic sphere enclosed on three sides with one large opening in the front. It is made for children who have developmental disabilities such as autism as well as physical challenges.

"It's at a height that kids in wheelchairs can climb into it," said Tim Hollinger, owner of the Santa Clarita-based company Sun Country Systems that installed the sphere.

"It has texture in it and movement," said Deborah Brown, president of the Camarillo Amber's Light Lions Club, which raises money to provide playground equipment for handicapped children. "It's a quiet space for children to go to and feel safe."

Brown said the round enclosure is important for autistic children who are overstimulated by the playground and need a place to escape.

"We did a lot of research to help us make a decision on what type of piece to get," Brown said.

The 34-member club was

named after Amber Farlow, an Australian child with physical disabilities who couldn't play on regular playground equipment. Amber died on April 15 at age 9 due to health complications.

"I keep in touch with (Amber's) mom, Michelle, so she sees what we're doing out here in her daughter's name," Brown said, adding that it was exciting for the club to be able to purchase a piece of equipment in its first year.

The club raised \$3,400 to buy and install the sphere at the park by selling baskets of local produce.

The park district and the club will unveil the sphere at 11 a.m. tomorrow, July 14, at the park.


